

Greek digital collections go to primary school: Resources and infrastructure for learners and teachers

This talk will introduce Greek digital collections openly available to educators, researchers, and the general public via *SearchCulture.gr*. *SearchCulture.gr* is the Greek national cultural content provider for *Europeana*, the biggest portal of digitised cultural heritage collections in Europe, funded by the European Union.

In the 7 years that have passed since its launching, *SearchCulture.gr* has contributed more than half a million items contributed by 78 Greek memory institutions (libraries, archives, museums etc.) including historical documents and manuscripts, books, photographs, cartographic material, material culture, art, 3D models and audio-visual material of archaeological items.

The talk will focus on how this digital content can be utilized for the teaching of some of the most sought after 21st century skills in the era of data-enabled artificial intelligence technologies, notably critical thinking, creativity, soft skills, and data literacy skills.

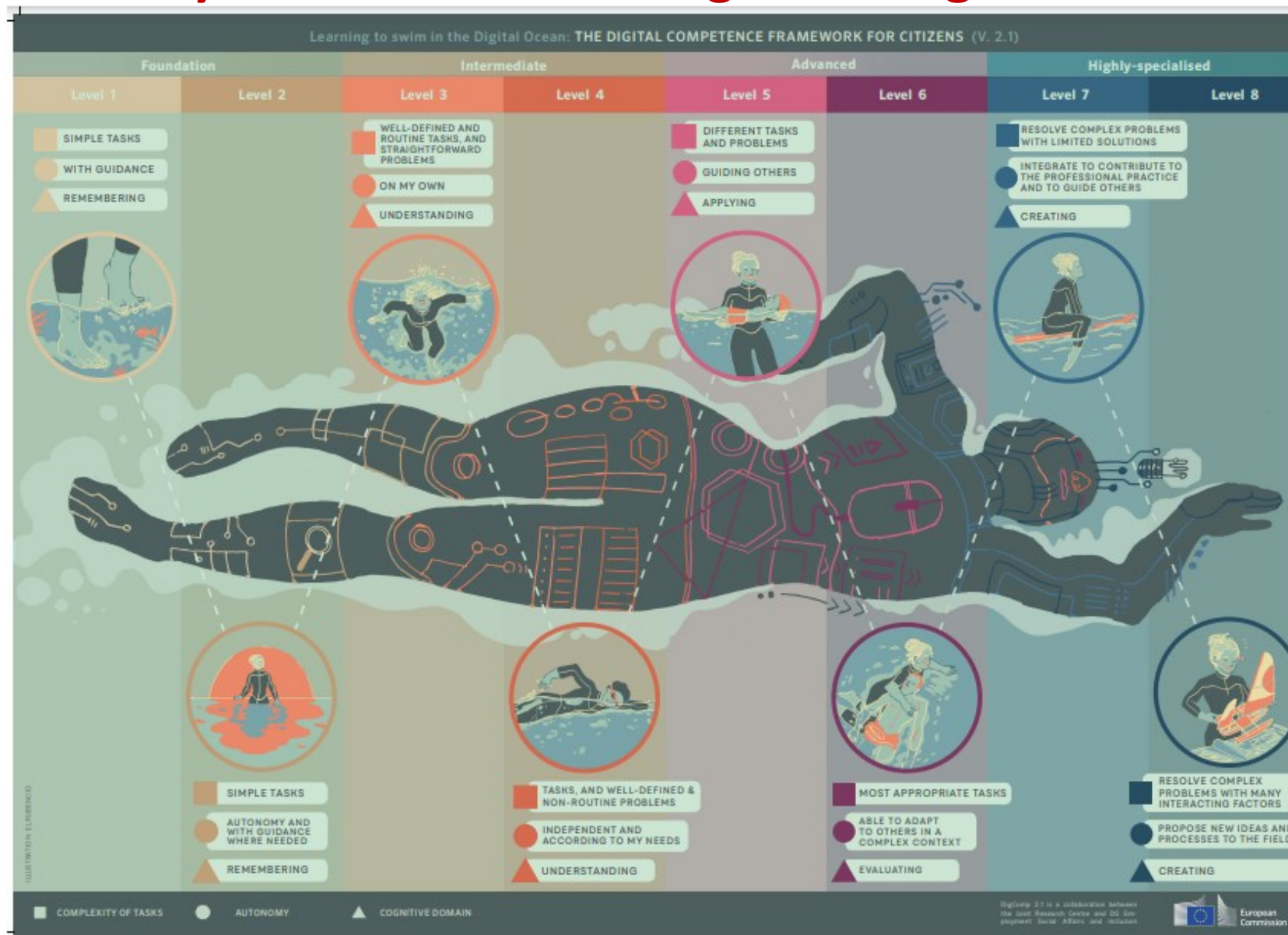

[SearchCulture.gr](#) is the [accredited National Aggregator](#) for Europeana for Greece. It has developed workflows and procedures for integrating its content into the European Digital Library. Presence in Europeana ensures even greater visibility for the participating institutions. So far, [SearchCulture.gr](#) has contributed over 562,119 items from 54 collections/owning institutions to Europeana.

Europeana is a Foundation based on the Netherlands, run by a Board of Directors representing bodies and associations of GLAMs from all over Europe. Since 2008, Europeana developed its portal and now hosts over 50 million digital cultural resources. Europeana has made a significant contribution to the development of a common European consciousness, not only for museums, libraries and archives, but also for citizens and innovation communities. It spearheaded the creation of networks of content collaboration and re-use. At the same time, it highlighted the value of coexistence of heterogeneous digital cultural content and the possibilities of multiple narratives for objects and testimonies of our shared heritage.

For culture, Europeana has been a catalyst, sharing good practices and know-how about content aggregation, as well as participating in pan-European multi-partner projects with a focus on fashion, music, photography and shared European heritage. Its licensing policy, supported by the Open Access movement and the use of Creative Commons licenses, have contributed both to the circulation of knowledge and to the protection of copyright. 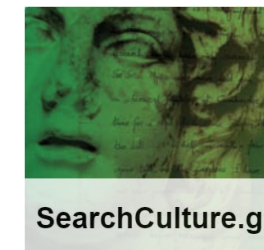

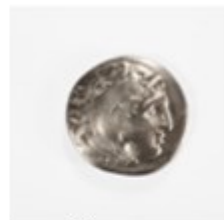

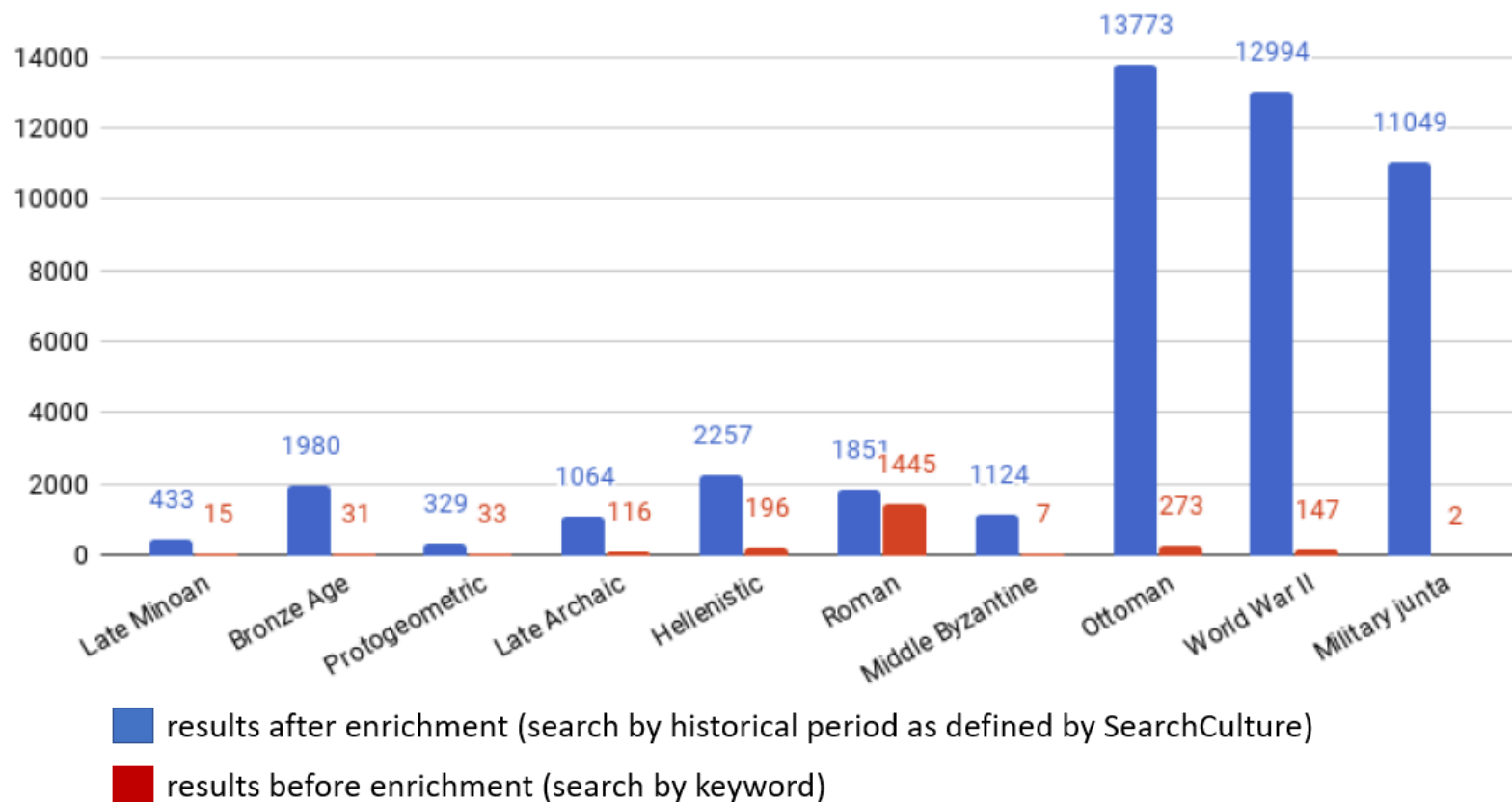

Searchability of 10 chronological periods of Greek history before and after semantic enrichment

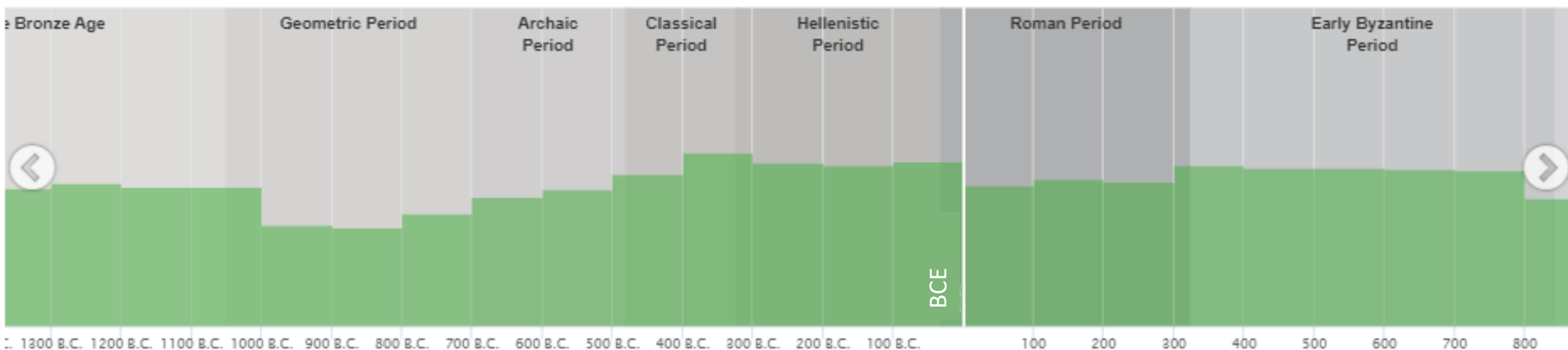

When the option is checked, an item is considered to belong to a historical period only if that period coincides with or contains the period of the item.

The Olympic Games have grown exponentially over their 120-year history and incorporate more sports. From the 9 sports included in the first contemporary Olympic Games in Athens in 1896, the program now includes 33. We see a similar growth in the number of communication tools required for their organization and the number of souvenirs created to commemorate them. Collectors all over the world passionately buy and sell Olympic memorabilia.

This thematic exhibition presents a variety of memorabilia, including medals, mascots, souvenirs, torches and the official Olympic posters of many Games. The branded material that was developed for each of the Games reflects the style of each period, the character of the host city as well as the socioeconomic conditions in which the Games took place.

However, as different as these conditions were, from 1896 to today, the Olympic philosophy remains unaltered and promotes the principles of tolerance, peace, ethical competition and noble rivalry in order to create a peaceful society with less violence and competitiveness.

This Learning Scenario is focused on the theme of the Olympic Games. To provide a holistic approach, this Learning Scenario is underlying the history, the meaning, and the athletic festivity that Olympic Games manifest through the centuries from ancient Greece to nowadays the whole world.

Also, through this Learning Scenario, basic current elements that connect with history are shown as Olympic torches, metals, sports and elements that are a current celebration of the Olympic Games like postcards and stamps, mascots, the manifestation of Olympic in art etc. The L.S. is considered for young primary school students aged between 9 yr. and 10 yr. and can be used in the curriculum of Greek schools as part of the history, gymnastics, or art subject. By the completion of it, students would be able to recall basic historical moments of the Olympic Games, would be able to spot and understand some key elements of the current Olympic Games, present sports that are part of them and of course learn about the honour and meaning that Olympic Games still stand for.

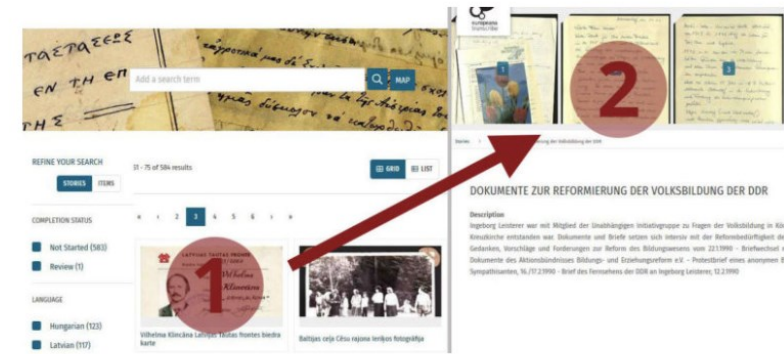


Enrich - Find a document and start transcribing

First, find an item (a single document) you want to enrich by searching and browsing the project collection on the **Discover** page. Here you can filter your search results by language, completion status, etc. Click on a story (1) and select an item from the story page (2), or select an item directly from your discovery results.

Additionally, you can search for the documents on the **map**.

You can only add new enrichments to items marked with the **grey** (Not Started) or **yellow** (Edit) statuses. Tasks for items in the **orange** and **green** statuses are explained in the **Review** section of this tutorial.

The topic and purpose of this lesson

Athenian democracy might be the most important contribution of the Ancient Greeks to modern day societies. The word “democracy” originates from the Greek “demos” (people) and “rule” (kratos). Democracy was applied in practice in the 5th Century B.C.E Athens.

In this lesson, you will learn what Athenian democracy was like and how philosophers who were living at the time continue to inspire thinking about democracy today. In the final step, you will share how far you think democracy has and could have since the Ancient Greeks.

Karagiozis, shadow puppet theatre

Shadow puppet theatre, an all time favorite folk tradition

Shadow theater flourished in many lands, including China, India, Persia, Indochina and Asia Minor. It seems to have come to mainland Greece, probably from Asia Minor during Ottoman rule. The moral tales enacted by the puppeteers feature satirical observations about the social and political issues of the time - a form of social commentary understood by people of all classes.

The central character is Karagiozis, whose name now represents the genre. Karagiozis is poor and uneducated, relying on his cunning and wit to survive, a Greek folk hero for children and adults.

The puppet show is usually accompanied by a singer with a small group of musicians as well as enough shouting and noise and witty dialogue keep the audience laughing. While there are scenarios and the plots are familiar, the puppeteer improvises and adapts storylines according to the audience, enhancing them with impromptu wise cracks and bawdy remarks.

The puppets are traditionally made from translucent camel or donkey skin. Worked until it is semi-transparent, the hide was cut into the desired shape and painted with vegetable pigments. The puppeteer moves the puppets using detachable rods. Between the figures and the player (who was invisible), were candles or lamps that shed light to the figures and made their silhouettes visible to the audience through the cloth.

The hilarious movement of the characters, the innocent beatings, the strange and ragged clothing, the cunning word games and numerous linguistic mistakes were what gave Karagiozis a special place in the hearts of Greek audiences for decades.

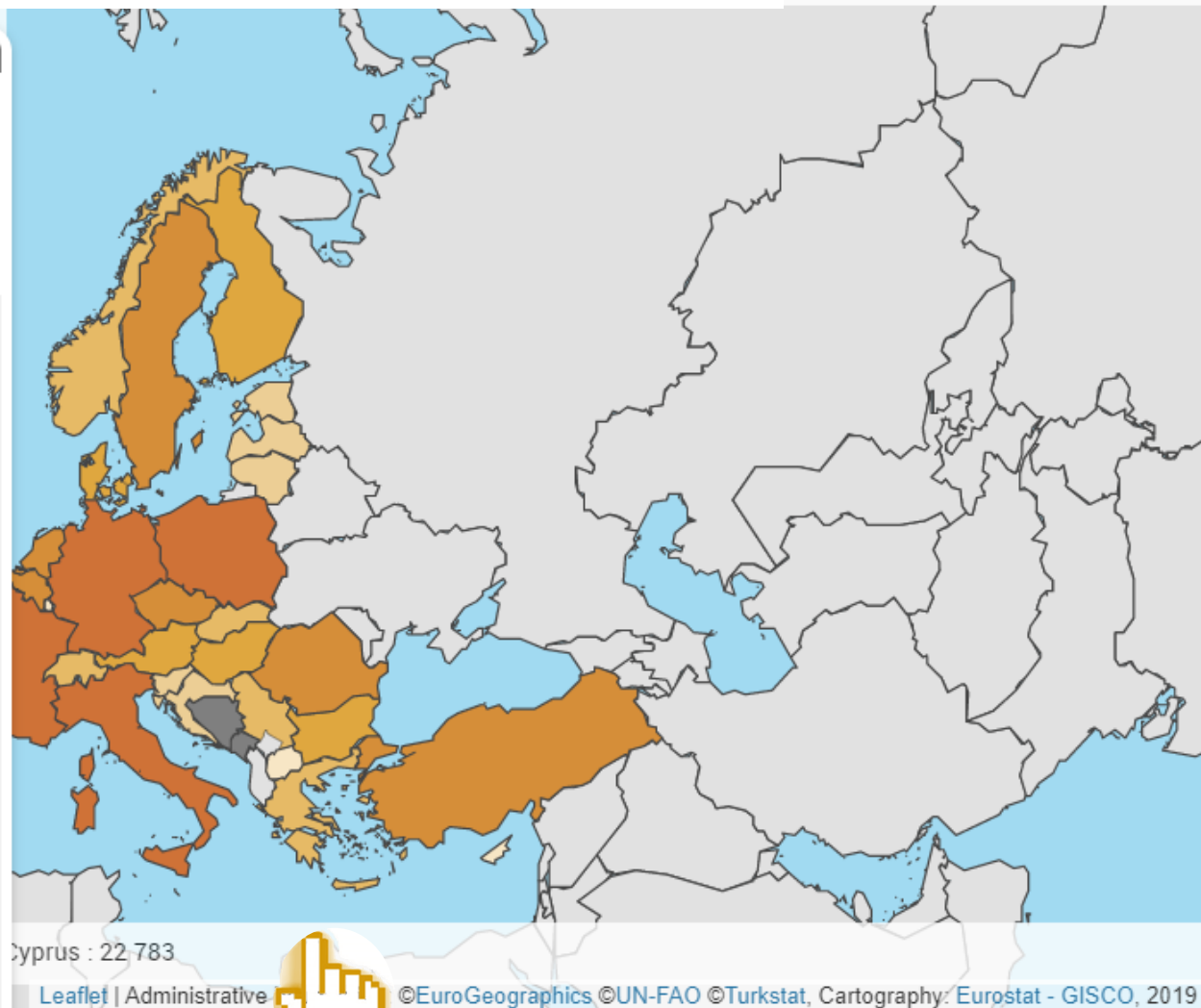
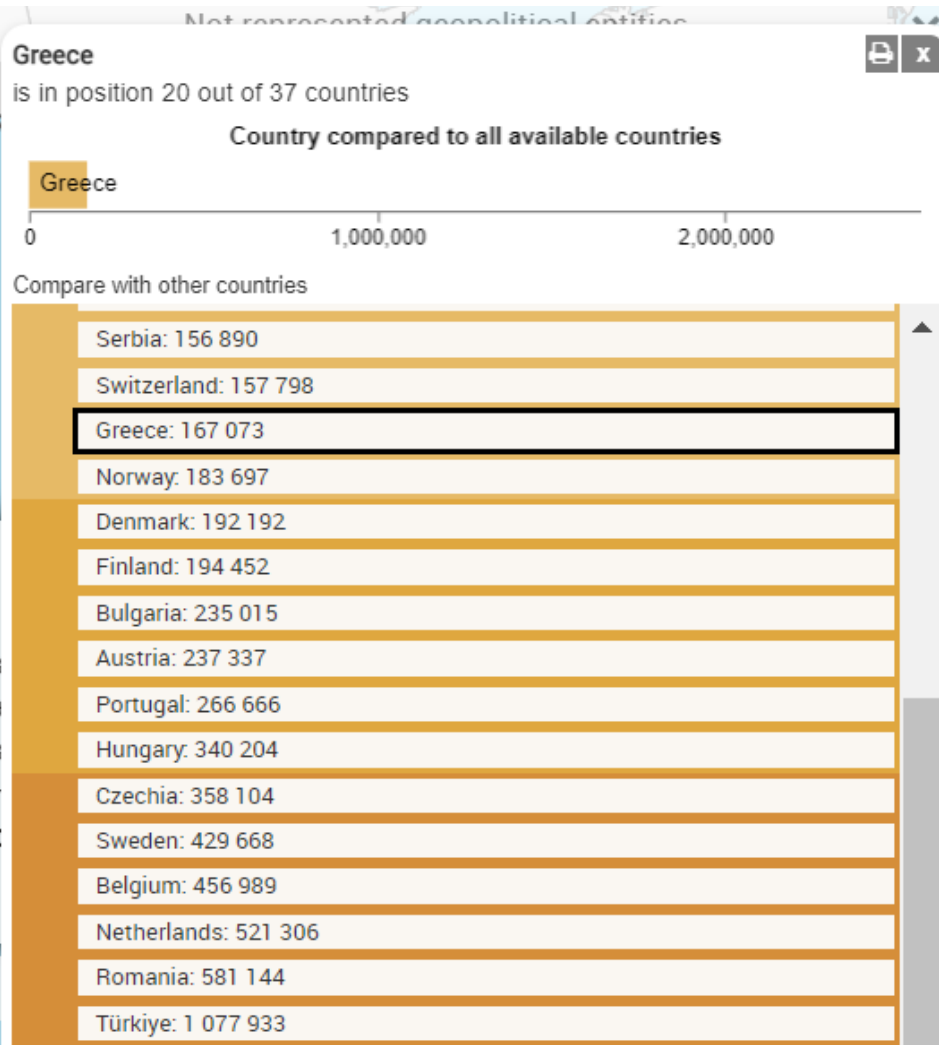
Key features:

- The Greek educational system is **centralised**. National laws, presidential decrees and ministerial acts are prevalent within it.
- The central administrative body for the education system across all fields, agencies and levels is the **Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs**.
- **At regional level**, the **regional education directorates** oversee the implementation of the national educational policy.
- **At local level**, the **directorates of primary and secondary education** supervise all schools in their area. In their turn, school units make sure they run smoothly.
- The **main route into teaching in primary schools** is to take a **4-year degree** in a pedagogical department.

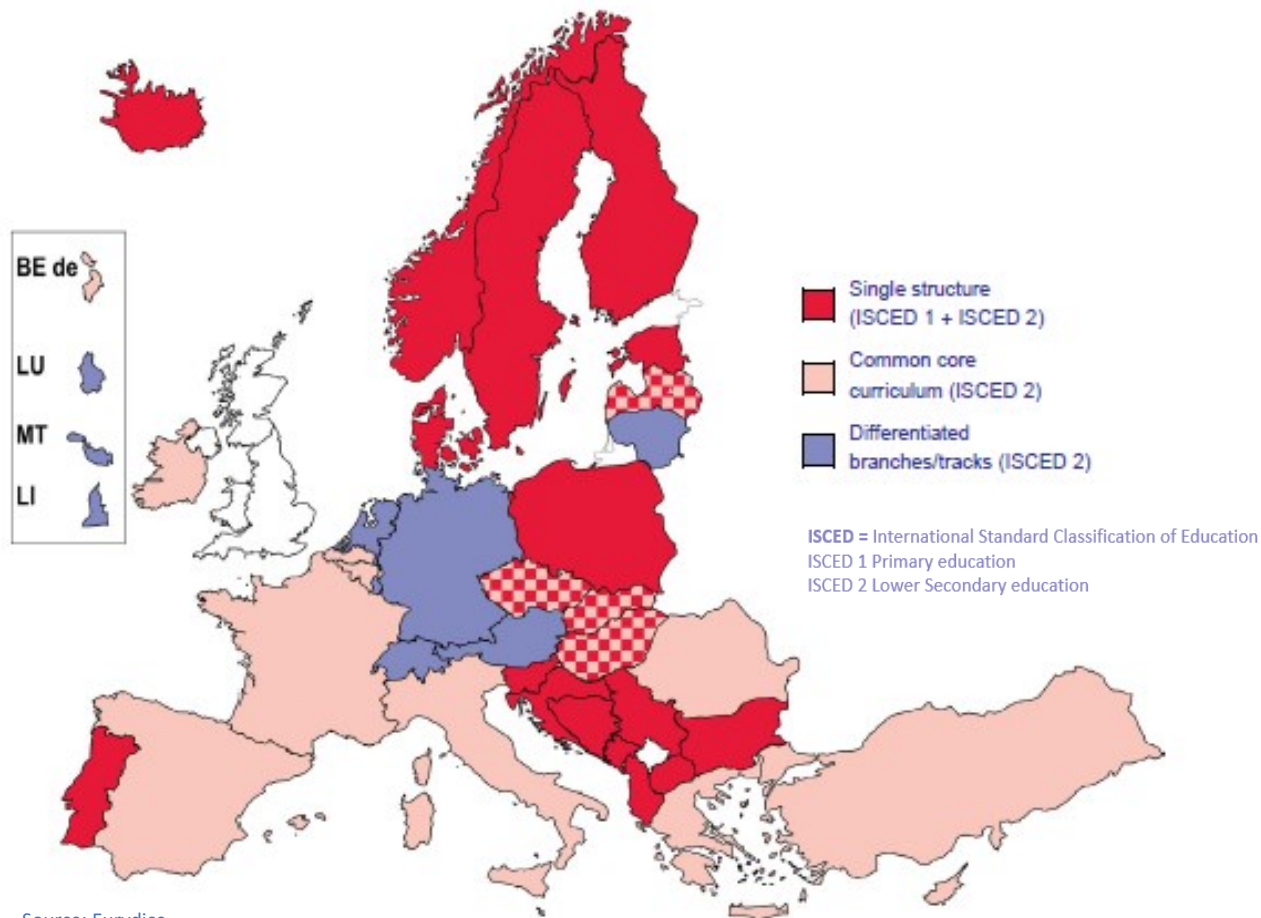

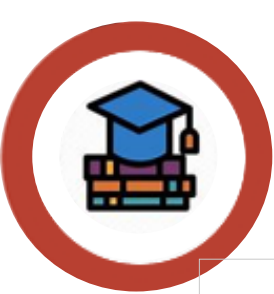

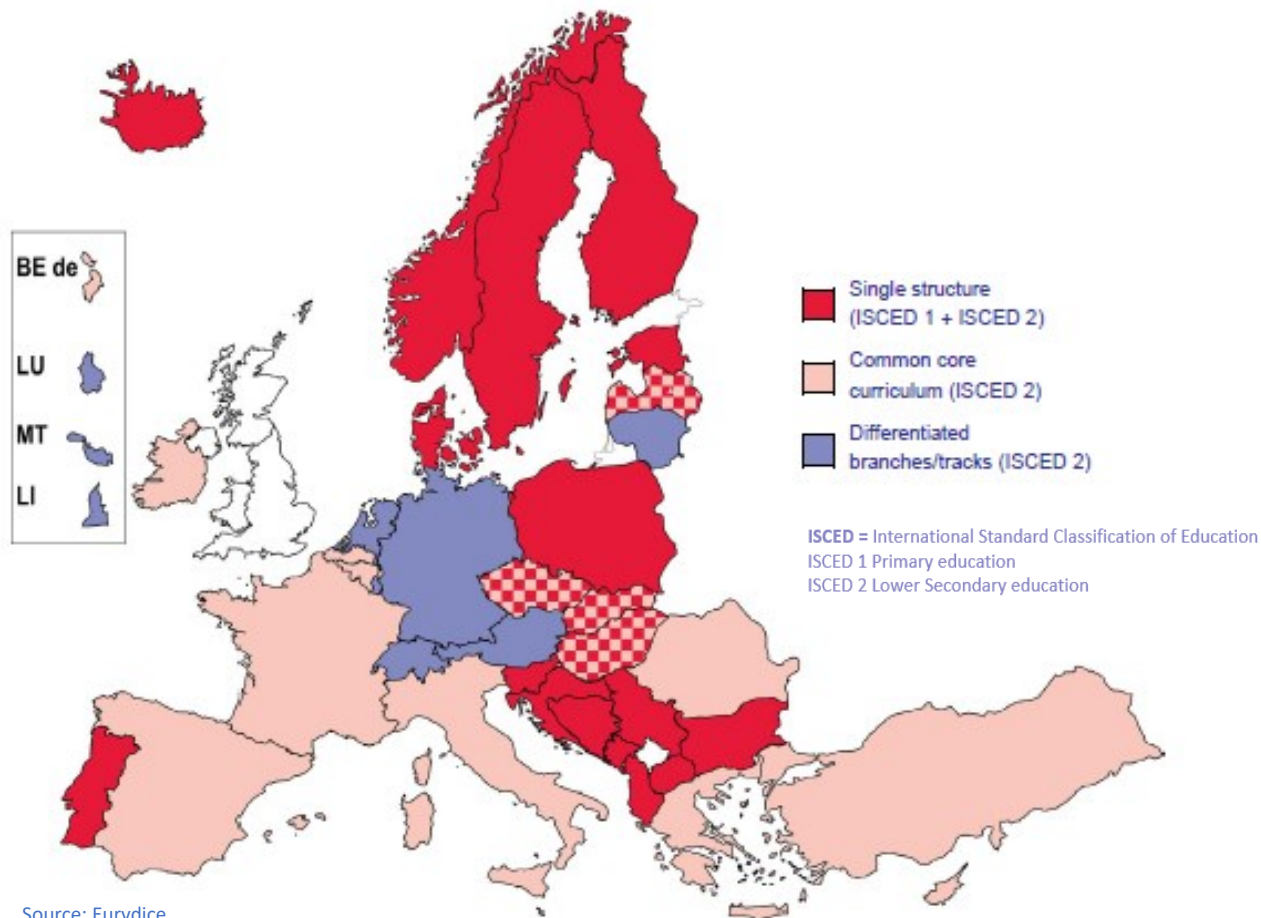

Main models of primary and lower secondary education in Europe, 2022/2023



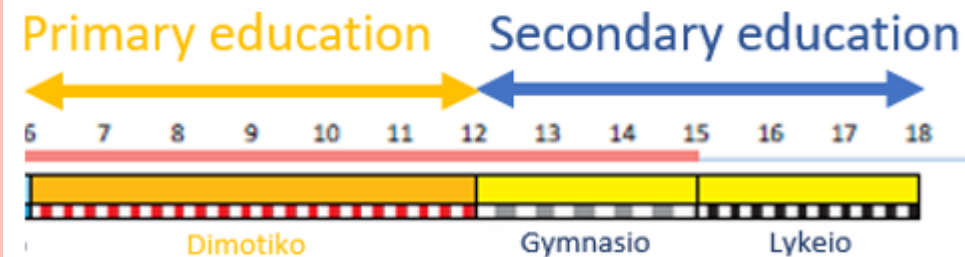

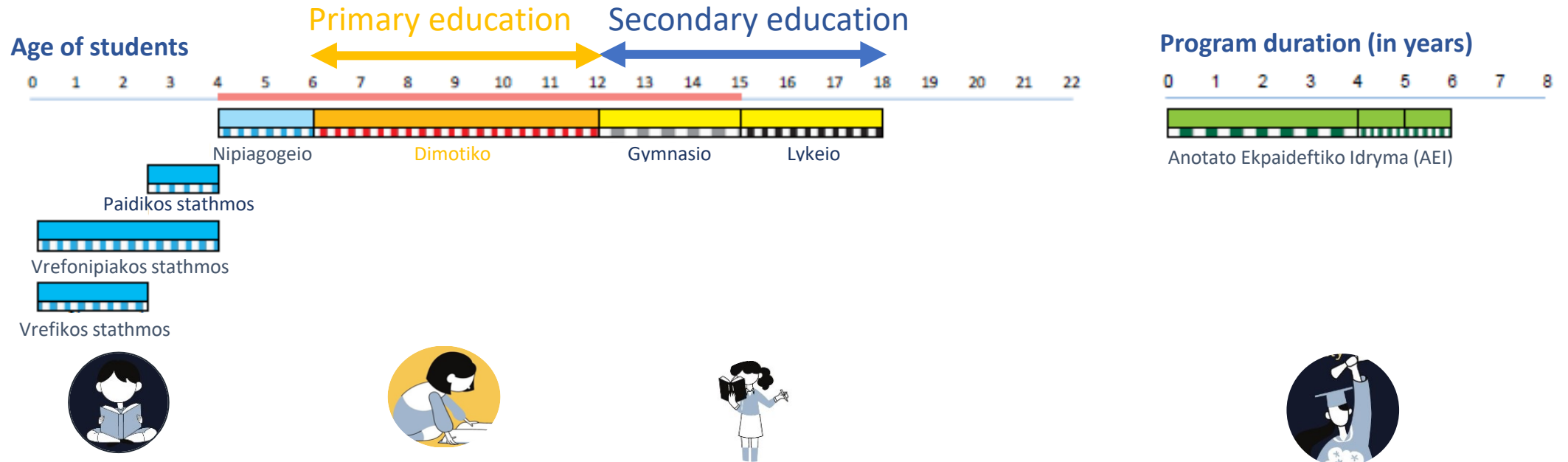
Main models of primary and lower secondary education in Europe, 2022/2023

Greece: After successfully completing **primary education**, all students progress to **lower secondary level** where they follow the same general common core curriculum.



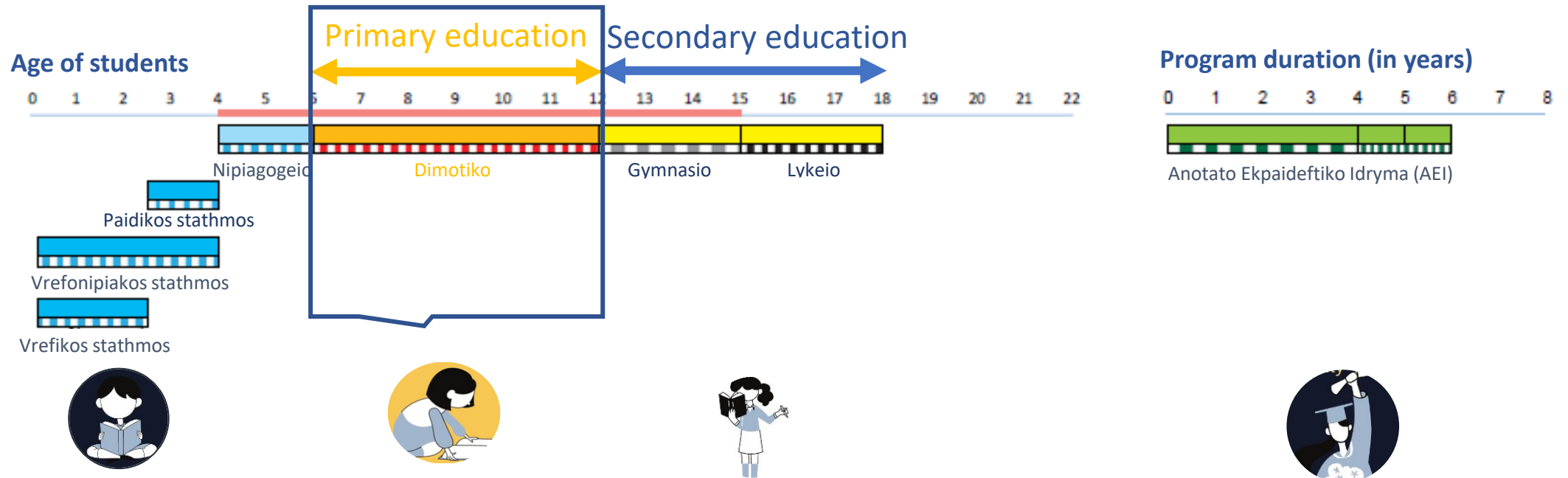

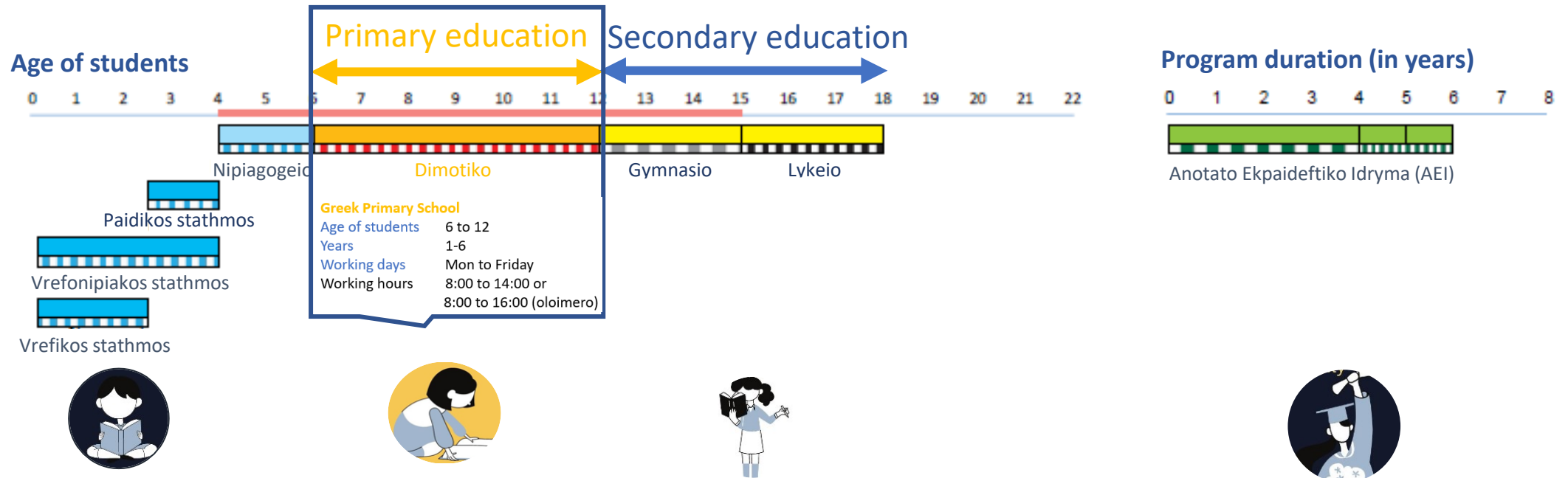
